Assessment	<p>Final Written and Oral Exam:</p> <p>The written exam includes exercises designed to assess listening, reading and writing skills as well as basic grammar and vocabulary. The written exam includes the following sections:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listening comprehension • Reading comprehension • Use of Spanish • Text composition <p>The oral exam consists of review questions covering the main topics studied during the course.</p> <p>Assessment for attending/non-attending students is the same since this is a course of no obligatory attendance.</p>

	<p>Duration written test: 75 minutes</p> <p>Duration oral test: 6 to 7 minutes</p>
Evaluation Criteria	<p>Partial assessments: weighting of parts: 80% written and 20% oral. (100 points: 80 points written, 20 points oral.).</p> <p>Relevant for oral assessment: clarity of answers, mastery of the Spanish language, grammatical accuracy.</p>
