Contents Summary	<p>The 100-hour orientation internship offers first-year students the opportunity to gain practical experience in a field of social education and to get to know various network partners. Through observation, conversations, active participation in the workplace, and job shadowing with different network partners, they gain insights into diverse institutions and fields of practice as well as their interconnections. They become acquainted with different target groups, approaches to practice, and institutional frameworks.</p> <p>In the accompanying courses, especially in the laboratory "Reflection on Socio-Educational Practice", students are prepared</p>

	and supported in reflecting on their professional experiences and experiences from the orientation internship in a theory-based, methodological, and biographical manner. They begin to establish initial theory-practice connections and critically examine their own professional perspectives. The orientation internship is supervised by an academic tutor.
