| Sintesi contenuti | This course explores the dynamic relationship between politics and economics, equipping students with tools to analyse how political forces shape economic outcomes and vice versa. More specifically: Analyses the interaction between political institutions and economic policy, including the effects of electoral systems, governance structures, and political incentives; Examines the role of media and social media in influencing public opinion, political accountability, and policy-making, with attention to polarization and misinformation; Explores the political economy of conflict and violence, focusing on the causes and consequences of civil unrest, |

| Modalità di esame | The closed book written exam will have 2 parts: Part 1 (1 hour) for all students with 2 questions covering different topics treated in the lectures, possibly with sub-questions, carrying equal weight, unless specified differently. Part 2 (30 minutes) for students who did NOT give a presentation with (an) additional question(s) focusing on the papers used for the student presentations. The final exam counts for 60% of the overall mark for students participating to presentations, and 100% for the other students. |
| Criteri di valutazione | Presentations will be assessed along three dimensions: slides, oral presentation, and understanding. The final exam will assess knowledge and understanding of the topics covered. |
