Course Topics	The course is aimed at acquiring further language skills. A course in specific language for business students based on C1 (CEFR).

	<p>The course focuses on the different language styles used in the fields of economics, politics and business administration and aims to improve students' receptive, but above all productive language skills in general (written and oral).</p> <p>Topics covered include an introduction to more complex grammatical structures used in this field and at this level, followed by practical applications. Another focus is on improving productive skills, especially writing skills, so that students can produce precise, coherent texts in German for professional use.</p>
