Specific Educational Objectives and Learning Outcomes (additional info.)	This teaching is part of the characterising training activities and, specifically, belongs to the field of law. The specific objective of the teaching is the acquisition of basic knowledge and skills in financial law, in particular in banking and securities market intermediation. The professional knowledge related to the teaching is integrated with the curriculum of the degree course in Economics, Politics and Ethics as well as Economics and Management and is aimed at the qualification of banking and securities activities from a legal point of view in order to understand the relevant institutes functional to the acquisition of professional skills typical for the professional outlets of the degree courses.
Assessment	For attending and non-attending students: the examination takes place in written form with 4 questions with 3 to be answered by choice (ILOs assessed: 1-5).
Evaluation Criteria	The answer is assessed in relation to relevance to the topic/question, correctness, argumentative and synthesising ability as well as propriety of language.
