Applying knowledge and understanding - Students analyse their own attitudes and individual approaches to the topic of sexual education. They also reflect on their own limitations and fears when dealing with this topic. - Independent planning and realisation of a thematic educational unit for kindergarten or primary school Judgement - Students are made aware of sexual education so that they are able to analyse situations objectively and act appropriately when working with children and parents. - Be able to assess the educational units independently developed

	and presented in the elective subject with regard to educational processes and child development Communication - A key objective is to enable students to help organise and conduct open and constructive discussions on the topic of sexual education in primary education. - Reflection and discussion on the importance of sexual education in primary education Learning strategies - Interactive engagement with the topic. - Participate in the discussion/reflection on the exercises and methods presented and tested in the elective subject - Reflect on their own attitude to the topic - Deepening and developing the subject content - Being able to plan and implement holistic programmes on the topic for different age groups
