Art der Prüfung	- written exam - (open-ended questions) + applied projects to be discussed during lectures/class presentation/written paper (min. 15 pp. + bibliography) to be agreed with the lecturer and submitted 20 days before the exam date.
Bewertungskriterien	The final grade will be based on: relevant to the written exam (with questions): ability to interact with the concepts and theories and apply them to everyday situations; logical structure, ability to argue, accuracy, etc. For project, classroom presentation or written essay, the following will be assessed:
