Sintesi contenuti	The course Microeconomics introduces students to the foundational principles of economic thinking and analysis. It covers essential topics such as demand and supply, utility theory, market structures (e.g., perfect competition, monopoly, oligopoly), taxation, externalities, and game theory. The course emphasizes analytical reasoning and the ability to

	critically assess how individuals and firms make decisions under various constraints.
