Contents Summary	<p>A healthy, 'good sounding' voice, clear articulation and pleasure in verbal and non-verbal communication are fundamental tools for the profession in the field of communication and culture.</p> <p>Knowledge of the physiological fundamentals of the phonatory apparatus, the rules for good pronunciation, and the vocal means</p>

	of processing and preparing texts will help provide the tools to express oneself clearly and comprehensibly in linguistic communication and to be able to use one's own voice successfully.
Course Topics	<p>Voice training: listening-vocal comprehension. Physiological fundamentals of spoken language.</p> <p>Posture (internal-external) and breathing. Relaxation exercises, breathing and resonance exercises. Voice, support, resonance, voice volume.</p> <p>Breathing as a basis for speaking.</p> <p>Exercises to loosen and widen the laryngeal cord, to use the different voice tones, for sound attack, to relax, to articulate vowels and consonants.</p>

	<p>content, without limiting themselves to this, in order to make valid judgements and to independently design further learning processes.</p> <p>Communication skills Students should be able to communicate externally the content they have acquired and the conclusions they have reached from it clearly and distinctly, to exchange ideas with others about it at a high level, to work in a team and to take responsibility for projects.</p> <p>Learning skills During the course, independent learning is to be promoted by tackling subject-specific texts and exercises with the aim of expanding and deepening the knowledge acquired in autonomous self-reflection and/or group work.</p>
