	Non-attending students should complete all the writing exercises done in class (available on OLE) and they should send them to the lecturer for formative assessment following the submission guidelines posted with each exercise.
	Summative assessment - 60% written exam – exercises and writing task - 4/5 grammar and vocabulary exercises within a clear specialised context: open cloze, multiple choice, error correction, word and sentence transformation questions; 1 writing production task of 300 words based on subject-specific input ILOs assessed: 1, 2, 3, 4
	40% Oral exam - discussion and tasks: to demonstrate an upper-intermediate (B2/B2+) command of both spoken production and interaction. ILOs assessed: 1, 2, 3, 4
	Non-attending students are expected to contact the lecturer at the beginning of the course to organise an individual learning pathway in order to be prepared for the final exam as detailed above.
