The oral examination consists of: - Presentation of a topic - Professional presentation (for non-participating students) During the practical sessions, participating students receive a grade for their professional presentation. |
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| Examination - written examination (max. 20 points - for non-participating students max. 30 points) - in the lecture (max. 10 points) - oral examination (max. 20 points - max. 30 points for students not present) - during the practical exercises (max. 10 points) |
