| | Writing Task This is worth 70% of the overall written exam mark. |
| | You must pass the written exam to be eligible for the oral exam. |
| | Oral Exam. A presentation and discussion based on a given topic. |
| | Optional cum laude/extra credit tasks. These will be made available throughout the semester, which combined allow for a maximum of 2 points out of 30. These points are added after the final exam result. |
| | Candidates must demonstrate their ability to communicate effectively in formal and academic ("scientific") English at the CEFR level of between B2 and C1. |
