Contents Summary	Introduction to qualitative and quantitative methods for analyzing social phenomena. Focus on research design, data collection, analysis, and ethical reflection in social work.
Course Topics	The module provides a comprehensive introduction to qualitative and quantitative research methods, including interview techniques, participant observation, surveys and statistical analysis. Students learn to develop research designs, plan and conduct their own research projects and critically interpret data. Practical laboratory exercises encourage the application of methods such as grounded theory and multivariate statistical procedures. Particular attention is paid to reflecting on ethical challenges, the use of digital tools and the interpretation of social inequalities.

Contents Summary	Introduction to quantitative research methods in social research: data collection, statistical analysis, modeling, and interpretation. Focus on practical application with software tools.
Course Topics	In-depth study of descriptive and inferential statistics. From data management to hypothesis formulation and testing. Use of statistical software.
Teaching Format	Classroom lectures, data analysis and class discussions. Since the lectures will be based on the analysis of real data, students will use their own laptops with SPSS installed, or they will need to reserve a laptop from the library on the day of the lecture.
