The dossier contains written work on key aspects of the programme that students complete outside the classroom.  The deadline for submission will be communicated on Teams.  The oral exam is divided into two parts:  - Presentation of an agreed topic (PowerPoint)  - Discussion of the contents of the dossier and topics covered in class
